Let Me Call you Sweetheart is a classic country love song popular in the late 30's when Ken and Evelyn met and were courting. Performed by Bing Crosby in 1934, by Gene Autry, Pat Boone, and Doris Day, it was even sung by Oliver Hardy in the 1938 film Swiss Miss, made with his comic partner Stan Laurel.
